Siblings in Christ,

What a joy it has been to be together in worship as we start the school year! The sound of children in the sanctuary and in the Sunday school rooms is a delight to be heard.

It is hard to believe that a little over a year ago I stepped out on paternity leave, and Anna and I welcomed Theo into our lives and into this wild and wonderful world. Time has moved swiftly and parenthood is a beautiful, albeit sometimes crazy, gift. I am grateful that he, and we, have all of you as our church family. As his nap times shift, we look forward to more opportunities to be in worship together.

Marking time has been interesting during a pandemic, yet it seems that this fall marks a shift. Since the start of the pandemic we have navigated changes at a remarkable speed and we've not had the luxury of looking further ahead than a few weeks or months. While the pandemic continues, we are living with it in different ways, especially given the release of bivalent boosters and vaccines for the youngest children. As such, our Council gathered in August and September for short retreats, to discern and begin to look ahead. One of the things that was clear from those gatherings was that we need to find ways to listen and discern as a congregation, not just as a Council.

Our Council decided that offering a survey, and opportunities to gather and talk about the survey questions, would be a place to start. We discussed survey questions, and a small team honed the questions and assembled the survey. It is now available online (https://bit.ly/MLCMQTsurvey) and in the church office. The questions on the survey will also be used to guide conversations, and listening sessions, within small groups. Council members will facilitate gatherings on October 9th & 16th at 12:00 pm & 3:00 pm, and also on Monday, October 17th at 7:00 pm. You can sign up for a group/time on the Welcome Table outside the church office or by calling the church office. Our goal is to have everyone participate. Whether you're a lifelong member or just a recent participant in our community, we want to hear from you! If you'd rather fill out the survey and not attend a conversation, that's fine. We want to offer multiple ways to receive input and are delighted to have you participate in whatever manner works best for you.

I'm delighted that we're beginning to look further ahead and to dream about what is next for our Messiah community. I hope that you'll see in the questions our desire to embrace what works well for our community and lean into who we are – all 141 years of tradition and transformation.

One of the things that I think about now, as a parent, is what type of church will exist when Theo is an adult. I do not know the answer to that question, but I do know that it will come about through the work and faith of people like you. Together, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we are the church. I look forward to the conversations and responses from this survey and to what lies ahead, and I know our Council does too.

Thank you for participating in this process. If you have questions or want to chat about these questions one-on-one over coffee, please don't hesitate to reach out.
