From Pr. Andrew

Siblings in Christ,

As we begin the season of Advent, I can't help but think about the stories, scriptures, and traditions of the Christmas season that have been passed down in my family. Storybooks, like "Apple Tree Christmas" by Trinka Hakes Noble, family recipes for Springerle and Spritz, wooden nativity figures that have weathered generations of children, and favorite albums (Leslie Odom Jr. or Aaron Neville, anyone?).

We all enter this season with a swell of memories and emotions. Good ones, hard ones, and ones we'd rather forget. Memories embedded in sights, sounds, smells, and spaces. In the midst of them is the Christmas story. A story we've heard so many times before. It's a story that we've read and sung, and acted out in pageants. It is a story that intersects with our own and calls us to remember how God has shown up in the past and to witness the presence of God as Jesus – in flesh and in bone. It is a story that also looks to the future and calls us to continue the work of collective liberation. It is a story that informs and performs in our lives, drawing us together as children of God.

As we walk through the story of Jesus' birth this year, we will do so in a series called "From Generation to Generation." Throughout this worship series, we invite you to take a closer look at how the Christmas story unfolds. As we read familiar stories, I encourage you to pay attention to each of the characters and to ask:

• What did each person pass on or contribute?

• How did they either participate in God's liberation and love—or try to thwart God's justice?

• What can we learn from them, and what is our role now? What will we pass on to the next generation?

Our heritage is part of this story. This season reminds us of the ways our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together. Our memories, our families, our messiness are all woven into the story of Jesus.

This Advent season I encourage you to pick up a devotional from the Welcome Table. Make time to reflect on these stories and the ones of your own family. Join us for Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesdays. Come for the Longest Night on December 21st . Join us in worship as we pay attention to the work of God, always unfolding—in and through us, together.
