

Siblings in Christ,

As we sit on the threshold of a new year, Christmas is not far behind us. In fact, we're in the 12-days of Christmas – that time between Christmas Day and Epiphany when we celebrate the arrival of the magi and their gifts. The expectant waiting of Advent has been replaced by Christmas joy and, now, by the turning of a calendar year and the return of the regular rhythms of our daily lives. Christmas trees, decorations, and cards will soon be put away. New gifts will lose their sheen. Carols are no longer a constant on the radio.

Scholars don't really know when the first Christmas occurred. It could have been July, for all we know. Ultimately, the calendar date isn't as important as what Christmas is and what it does. I appreciate this litany written by the late Howard Thurman, an African-American theologian, educator, and civil rights leader:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

The work of Christmas has begun.

That is what the church is up to in this world. A child born in a manger becomes a man crucified on a cross. Jesus comes in the darkness of the night and then again in the darkness of a tomb. He comes for us that we might know that our God loves us. From him we learn that evil and sin don't have the last word, that darkness cannot overcome the light, and that there is abundant grace for every one of us.

This means finding the lost, healing the broken, feeding the hungry, releasing the prisoner, rebuilding nations, bringing peace among people, and making music. It isn't always easy work, but it is what the grace of God has freed us to do. God comes to us in the ordinariness of a Bethlehem night, in the rushed frenzy of a smelly stable, and God comes to us today, too. God comes so that the ordinary can become holy and that we can be instruments of peace, love, joy, and hope.

I give thanks for the work of our congregation. We see the work of Christmas in our volunteer social workers and Community Assistance Fund, in our community meals, in the hours of volunteering (whether knitting, quilting, or offering rides or meals), in your support of our Asylum-seeking family, and in your generosity toward world hunger, disaster assistance, and so much more. We see the work of Christmas in the visits to those who are homebound or in the nursing home, and visits to those who are part of our wider community but not our church family. We see the work of Christmas in our Sunday School classes, confirmation, and in adult gatherings around books and bible studies. We see it in the partnership with Gretchen's House (renovations are now expected to start this month) and in the diligent work of our Council, committees, and teams. We see the work of Christmas in our music and give thanks for Sara, Kathy, Jacob, Jocelyn, our amazing band, and all the other singers and instrumentalists who share their gifts of music with us. The work of Christmas is all around us and there is much more of it to do.

As you look to the new year and watch the physical signs of Christmas be put away, I encourage you to look to the work of Christmas. Look for places where you can be present with those in need and where you can advocate for those who need your support. Look for ways that you, and our congregation, can share Christmas in this world, not only in December.

Maybe you know Thurman's litany through the song that Jim Strathdee wrote in 1969. Each verse touches on the work of Christmas and then the chorus is this:

'I am the light of the world! You people come and follow me!' If you follow and love you'll learn the mystery of what you were meant to do and be.

Friends, the work of Christmas calls to us. It reveals to us who and whose we are. Let's get to work.

To date, we have distributed a record amount in 2023 – nearly \$45,000 in assistance to over 450 individuals/families [funds are generally distributed in amounts of \$200 or less].
