Siblings in Christ,

In my first year of seminary, we read Anselm of Canterbury's Cur Deus Homo (Why God Became Man). Written sometime around 1000 c.e., the text is early church doctrine and includes Anselm's understanding of atonement, or what Jesus did on our behalf. Essentially, Anselm posited that since one of God's characteristics is justice, any affront to that justice must be atoned for.

Now, while that intellectual conversation can be interesting, I was far more interested in the humanity of Jesus and what that meant about my own humanity. It was the first time that I explored what it meant that my body was made in the image of God. That any "body" is made in that image. Too often, I think, our theologies and traditions relegate the body as secondary. Theologies that choose to start with the Fall instead of creation, that say that we are not our bodies.

It's a concept common in our world. It leads to bumper stickers like, "We are spiritual beings having a physical experience." Yet that belief separates the spiritual from the physical, making spiritual works a priority over the care of other people's bodies and even our own. The opposite can also be true, when we prioritize the care of others and ourselves over any sense of spiritual connection. Both fail to acknowledge the whole picture of a God who became human.

Our God, in Jesus, became flesh and dwelled among us. Broke bread, healed bodies, and suffered on the cross. Jesus wants us to pray and have a relationship with his father, but also says he despises our religious gatherings if all we do is pray and worship and neglect caring for the bodies of the hungry and the oppressed.

In reading Anselm all those years ago, I realized that I needed to affirm creation in its wholeness -- undivided body and soul included. And that included my body – missing an arm, sometimes strong, sometimes feeble. It included all bodies, not just society's perfect image of one.

Later, as I did doctoral work, I read Elisabeth Moltmann-Wendel's book I Am My Body: A Theology of Embodiment, and believe she articulated well what it means to live out this embodied theology:

Disembodiment is lovelessness. Insecurity, coldness, power and weariness are hidden behind abstraction. A theology of embodiment mistrusts all self-made fantasies of the beyond which are engaged in at the expense of the healing of people here and the realization of the kingdom of God on this earth. It is committed to a this-worldly expectation which here already looks for full, complete life, for wide spaces for women and men, and from this work derives the hope that nothing can separate us from the life and love of God.

As we walk through this season of Lent together, our theme is "Embodied." It is something personal for each of us, yet also impacts how we see one another and who we are as a community. It informs our understanding of God and how we are the church together. I hope you'll join us on this journey.

In closing, I want to share the blessing "letting yourself be known" from Kate Bowler's new book, *Have a Beautiful, Terrible Day!* The book is fantastic and includes a wonderful companion for Lent, by the way.

I work quietly, in secret, to repair all that is broken *This* anxiety and *that* despair. (Other problems I avoid altogether)

There is no use telling you, I reason. This is mine to fix.

But your eyes see everything, God. Why can't I see that as the gift it is? But am I seeing you, fixed from above with the pixelated precision of drone warfare.

Your omniscience would be terrifying, exhausting to imagine,

or, worse, humiliating.

But you come from below, Jesus. Bleary eyes in a manger. A steady gaze as you walk among us. Or stare straight from the cross.

You look at me with nothing more, nothing less, than the love that first interrupted my life with your presence. There is no protecting you from me. Or me from you. From my insecurities and apathy, from the shrug of my shoulders when you say that you are here to love me in aliveness.

Nothing is hidden from you, God.

You can see it all.

What a gift, God. What a gift.

- Anything left at the end of the sale will be donated to St. Vinny's or another second hand store.

Letter from Bishop Finegan

Welcome to the Year of our Lord 2024! In this new year, I announce our Synod themes for the next three years, Seed Sowers:

2024 - I Planted 2025 - Apollos Watered 2026 - God gave the Growth

Last year at Synod Assembly, Seed Sowers was the theme for our inaugural Seed Sowers Luncheon that thanked people who had made a planned gift (meaning that they remembered NGLS/ELCA in their will) or were considering doing so. In essence, they were a "Seed Sower," planting seeds for future ministry, seeds that they knew they would not see grow and bear fruit. However, being a Seed Sower is not limited to those who have planned a legacy gift. After all, are we not all Seed Sowers? Do we not, all of us, plant seeds for future ministry, even as we enjoy the growth from seeds that were planted generations ago?

We plant seeds as we try and pass the faith on to the next generation. We want our children and grandchildren to be blessed by the community of faith in the same way we have been. We stretch our financial capacity to ensure sustainability for years to come. We build a reputation in our communities that we care, and we're ready to serve those in need. We raise up leaders for future generations by nurturing their gifts for ministry. We are every day, Seed Sowers.

At this time of great transformation and change in the Church, it is good to be reminded that the Church is about more than what we experience in the here and now. And there are many ways that a congregation can plant seeds for future ministry.

I think of the faithfulness of St. James in Marinette, WI. Founded in 1918, Shining with the Light of Christ in the Northern Great Lakes Synod Northern Light this community of faith has been hard at work for the sake of Christ for 106 years. This past autumn, the people of St. James discerned that their last worship service will be Sunday April 14, 2024.

While this decision is difficult for all who love St. James, it also witnesses to their faithfulness. As people who believe in a God who brings new life from death and light from darkness, the work of St. James has not been in vain. This community of faith has accomplished that for which it was created and has completed that for which it was purposed. God will bring new life and growth from the seeds that St. James will plant. In the weeks to come, the people of St. James will consider how best to use their assets to support the work of Christ through ministry partners. Their legacy will provide resources to further the purposes of God long after the doors of St. James are closed.
