Colombia Delegation 2024! - June 21 - July 2

We're excited to share that a small group from our congregation will be visiting our siblings in Christ in Bogota from June 21 - July 2! Due to the pandemic, Messiah has not sent a group to Colombia since 2018 and it is time to rekindle those relationships, reconnect with the congregation of Luz y Vida, and to share meals and conversation as we share our experiences of these past 6 years. We hope that this will begin a return of rhythmic accompaniment visits, bringing visitors here (like Pr. Jairo, Ana, and Johanna who came in 2019) and sending groups of us there. This year the initial group will be Pr. Andrew, Jeanne Groos, and Anna & Justin Wild. The group plans to present to the congregation in July after their return.

There are two ways that you can assist this group: 1) please pray for them as they prepare and travel! And, 2) they will be collecting school supplies to take to some of the programs run by the Lutheran congregations in Bogota. Centering Prayer Group

There are two opportunities to meet together each week: during the day on <u>Tuesdays, from 11:00 am - 12:00 pm</u> or in the early evening on <u>Thursdays from 5:30-6:30 pm</u>. A short intro to the method will precede each meeting. So feel free to come at any time. Each meeting stands on its own. Meetings will take place at Messiah Evangelical Lutheran Church. All are welcome. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.

What is centering prayer? Centering prayer is a Christian form of meditation. Instead of talking to God, who already knows all things and all of our needs, it is a form of listening. The practice has simple steps:

The choosing of a sacred word, as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.

Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word as the symbol of your consent to God's presence and action within.

When engaged with your thoughts, (and "thoughts" include body sensations, feelings, images, and reflections) return ever-so-gently to the sacred word.

At the end of the prayer period remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes.

After our period of centering prayer, when hearts are more open to inspiration, we will have a reading to ponder. (Lectio Divina)

Summer Liturgy

For a portion of this summer, we will be using the liturgy from A Sanctified Art with the theme "I've Been Meaning to Ask..." From June 2nd through July 21st, this 8-week series will focus us on texts that foster curiosity, courage, and connection in these times fraught with division. Our rhythms in worship will only differ slightly. You'll notice there will be a reading of the day – this reading comes from the theme and a psalm will be paired with the reading. There will be fewer readings during this time because the main reading will be lengthier and tell a longer story.

Our hope in using this series is best expanded on by the authors themselves:

May this series help us to behold each other as images of the divine. May it help us strengthen our capacity for empathy and compassion. May it remind us of the power of asking unassuming questions. May it show us that courage is rooted in the heart. Through vulnerability and authenticity, may our courageous conversations lead us to glimpse hope, joy, and beauty—and to become the community God created us to be.
