# 10:30 Thursday Bible Study

The Thursday morning Bible study meets for an hour in Room 202 at 10:30. The group usually works through about three chapters of the Bible every week, in a lively discussion with lots of questions—and sometimes even some answers! Right now we're in the story of king David, who rose to power as a heroic warlord, then brought it down in rebellion by betraying people who trusted him. Next comes Solomon, for whom the Bible gives evidence leading in at least two directions. Was he a wise and holy king, giving justice and building the Temple? Or was he also a crafty tyrant, raising Israel to the peak of its power and wealth at the cost of enslaving the people and bringing the nation to the brink of collapse?

The Bible does not hand us superficial answers to questions like this. It's a book about real people, complete with both heroism and deadly flaws. Would you like to join us on Thursday mornings?

# **Centering Prayer**

"Thy Will be done."

Am I the only one who has trouble deciphering God's Will?

I began a meditation practice many years ago, not to develop any kind of relationship with the Creator, but to relieve my own stress. I understood, however dimly, that when I was in stress, I did not behave in the manner that connected me to my fellow humans.

As my practice continued, there were miraculous times when an internal Voice helped me to perceive situations differently. This led me to behave differently. My thinking became clearer, and my relationships improved. As a person who had been raised in a home of a believer, I identified the Voice that became available to me from meditation as the "Holy Spirit" or the "Christ" or "God" or "Atman" or the "Buddha within". All these are, to me, naming the same mystery.

The better I behave, the closer I get to sometimes doing the "will of God." And the closer I come to doing God's will, the more I like life. The more I have trust that things can be worked out; that we will learn that we are all part of each other and of God. I go to centering prayer twice a day now to fill up my well of Divine Love and Wisdom. It happens because I turn down my thinking, and just listen to the stillness. "Be still and know that I am God."

The practice is simple. Have the intention to consent to God's Presence and action within and then, turn down the personality's thoughts. Keep turning down the volume of the worldly "self" and listen to the Voice for God. In that way, I believe that God's will becomes clearer and following God's will is the key to a vibrant and peaceful life.
