

### Greetings and Happy New Year!

During my sabbatical and before I traveled to Scotland in October, I began reading about Celtic Christianity and felt called to the stories of St. Brigid. Historically, little is truly known about her, if we are seeking facts. Yet, she was an early Christian woman, her parents were probably Druid and Christian, stories are told about how her mother birthed her in the doorway, and legend says she was raised on the island of Iona, Scotland by the Druids. The stories of her life are fanciful at times and often mythic, yet they tell something deeply important about our human desire to connect with God. At her roots, Brigid was seen as the connection between two worlds: the old world of the druids, a people who worshipped the natural world, and the Christians who brought stories of Jesus to the pagan Celtic people. The Celtic Christians seamlessly wove together the old ways of care and reverence for the earth with the new stories of Christianity. Just as Brigid's mother gave birth to her in the doorway, a liminal space, Brigid represents this bridge between worlds with a Druid father and a Christian mother. For Christian people who still hold their Celtic roots close, a deep care for the earth and a witnessing to God's presence in every living thing becomes encapsulated in being of St. Brigid.

While I was in Scotland, I found out I was pregnant! We are due in June, so everything was very new during my time there in October. I felt pregnant because I was tired and nauseous, but something about being pregnant also felt surreal- not quite real. And so, I was looking for meaning. It was during this time that I learned other stories of Brigid. There is this beautiful image of her in the National Galleries of Scotland where a young Brigid is being flown from the island of Iona by two angels. They are carrying her to Palestine where myth says she was a midwife at the birth of Jesus. Obviously, Brigid was not alive at the time of Jesus, but this legend proclaims that she brought him into the world. Again, Brigid acts as a bridge, this time ferrying new life

from heaven into our world in the form of Jesus. As I looked upon this image of Brigid and thought about the love and care surrounding Jesus at his birth, I felt comforted. I needed a reminder of God's power to bring new life into the world and to connect heaven with earth. While I was searching for meaning in sabbatical and the experience of being newly pregnant, the stories of Brigid reminded me that God provides people and stories of what we need when we need it most.

As we move from Advent and Christmas into the new year, we venture into a liminal space carrying all of our experiences from last year and brimming with the hopes of a new year to come. We may find ourselves hoping for a bridge like Brigid to help ferry us from one to the next, but I know we will need God's wisdom to consider how the two connect: what of the old do we bring forward, how do we embrace the new, what changes, what stays the same? I hope that one of these stories of Brigid can offer some insight into this season and that you remember God's provision of what we need when you need it most.

### **Budget & Giving Update**

As the year wraps up, we wanted to reach out and give another year-to-date budget update. The final numbers will be available for our Annual Meeting (February 2nd), but here is where we stand as of the end of November.

\*Income through November: \$76,841 under budget (that is up \$16,972)

\*Underspending budgeted expenses through November: -\$48,860

\*Current deficit through November: \$27,981 (income deficit minus underspending).

\*To meet our 2024 budget, Messiah needs an average monthly giving income of ~\$50,000.

As we look toward 2025, we give thanks for your generosity and for your assistance in planning for the New Year. If you haven't yet submitted a 2025 Plan for Giving and can do so, we welcome your participation. This helps our Finance Committee and Council steward resources wisely. ### **Centering Prayer**

Do you know the meaning of life? Have you accepted the fact that as hard as we work to have a "good" life, it all ends anyway? So, what is the point?

Jesus taught us that the point is to accept God's Love for ourselves, so that we are able to share that love with the world. How do we do that? Jesus modeled for us how to do that. He regularly went to God, Whom Jesus identified as a loving Abba, and listened. Centering prayer is that kind of approach to God. We humbly acknowledge our ignorance and consent to God's Presence and action within. What we receive is unconditional love and grace, and answers to the questions we didn't know we had. Regular meditation practice opens the mind to new perception and brings the Advocate online to help us through our day-to-day lives.

We may miss the answer to our prayers because we have something specific in mind, when the answer is something more than we can imagine. Centering prayer opens our minds to what we don't know. It is also of benefit to practice with others. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am

there among them. Matthew 18:20

We meet each Tuesday at Messiah from 11-12 noon. You don't have to commit to regular attendance and you don't need to have ever tried meditation or centering prayer. The practice is simple:

Choose a sacred word as a symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.

Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word.

When engaged with thoughts\*, return ever-so-gently to the sacred word.

At the end of the prayer period (typically twenty minutes) remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes.

\*Thoughts include body sensations, feelings, images and reflections.

On this day when we remember the light of Christ revealed to the world, light a candle and ask God to fill you with hope and courage to share that light.

### <u>January 7 – Love Yourself</u>

Practice self-compassion today. Write down one thing you love about yourself and thank God for creating you so wonderfully.

### January 8 – Acts of Service

Do a small act of service for someone in need today. It could be helping a neighbor, donating to a charity, or volunteering your time.

Spend time outside or look at the beauty of nature. Let God's creation remind you of renewal and resilience.

Do something that brings you joy and rest—read a book, take a walk, listen to music, or sit in silence with God.

### January 17 – Share Hope with Children

Spend time with a child or pray for the children in your life. Remind them they are loved and cherished by God.

### January 18 – Care for the Vulnerable

Take action to help someone in need today, whether it's donating warm clothing, offering a ride, or simply being a listening ear.

### <u>January 19 – Forgiveness</u>

Is there someone you need to forgive? Pray for the grace to let go of resentment and trust God to heal.


