ELCA World Hunger

During Lent we usually focus on Hunger and the upcoming Synod Assembly World Hunger offering. The Assembly is May 16-18 and the need for Hunger Funds is greater than even as government funds are being cut. Please consider making this ministry a part of your Lenten Journey by sending your contribution to Messiah for our support of this effort.

Update on our Asylum-seeking Family (& Immigration and church)

As a church, we remain committed to walking alongside the asylum-seeking family we support. But the truth is, they're scared. The policies that shape their future are shifting, and what once felt like a slow but steady path forward now feels uncertain. We want to share what's happening and how we can continue to stand with them in faith and love.

U-Visa Program: Last year an opportunity arose for the family we support to apply for legal status through the U-Visa program, which protects victims of serious crimes who assist law enforcement. This offers them a potentially more secure path than the traditional asylum system, which remains overwhelmed with backlogs. While this is good news, it's still a long process, and uncertainty remains. They are doing everything right, but like so many others, they're waiting in fear, hoping the system won't fail them.

Sanctuary Policies: ICE recently changed its policies, rolling back protections for sensitive locations—including churches. That means places of worship are no longer guaranteed to be

safe spaces, and faith communities are pushing back. The Quakers have even taken legal action to challenge these changes. We're disappointed that the ELCA has not yet joined this fight. As a church committed to justice, we believe there's more we could be doing together. While we don't have the facilities to offer formal sanctuary, we will continue to advocate for the safety and dignity of all who seek refuge and a new home.

LIRS and LSS Under Attack: Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS – recently renamed Global Refuge) and Lutheran Social Services (LSS) are being unfairly targeted by public figures spreading misinformation, but their work remains vital. These organizations have faithfully served refugees and asylum seekers for years, offering legal support, resettlement assistance, and community care. The attacks against them are meant to discourage their work, but we stand with them and the people they serve.

This is a difficult moment, but our faith calls us to love our neighbors and walk with the most vulnerable. The family we support is not alone, and neither are we. Let's keep showing up—for them, for each other, and for the work God calls us to. If you'd like to get involved, reach out to the outreach committee.
